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## ***Emergency Management at the Oregon College of Oriental Medicine***

Emergencies can come without warning at any time. Being prepared to handle emergencies is an individual as well as an organizational responsibility. This guide has been developed by OCOM's Department of Facilities and the Campus Security Office to assist in minimizing the effects from such events. Please read the contents thoroughly. Once you are familiar with the information, you will be able to protect yourself and perhaps save the life of someone else.

The information included in this guide is intended to cover most emergency actions, but is not all-inclusive. Common sense must prevail when instructions are not available. No matter the nature of the crisis, **think before you act**, then act swiftly to minimize your exposure to danger. **Your safety is of primary importance.** If you have questions concerning a unique situation not covered in this manual or if you wish additional information regarding emergency preparedness, contact OCOM's **Facilities** office at 503-253-3443 x160 ([ocomfacilities@ocom.edu](mailto:ocomfacilities@ocom.edu)) or the Vice President of Operations and HR at 503-245-3443 x106 ([amber.appleton@ocom.edu](mailto:amber.appleton@ocom.edu)).

### **What you can do now**

Get to know your building and where the exits and fire extinguishers are. Keep this guide where it will be immediately available for quick reference in an emergency. Maintain personal emergency supplies at work or in your car such as a change of clothes, shoes, snacks, flashlight, and prescription medications. ### **Emergency Evacuation Assembly Areas**

**OCOM Campus** – The primary evacuation assembly area for students, staff, faculty, patients, and others is **one half block east of the campus building, across Naito Parkway to Waterfront Park**, at the Japanese American Historical Plaza.

**OCOM Hollywood Clinic** – If an evacuation of the OCOM Hollywood Clinic is required, the post-evacuation assembly area will be **the parking lot of the McDonald's restaurant located across NE Cesar Chavez Blvd.** from the clinic.

**Medical Emergencies** – If the situation requires immediate medical attention or is life threatening, **call 911**. If the medical emergency is not life threatening, call the VP of Operations at 503-253-3443 x106 or Facilities at x160, and provide:

- The location of the incident
- Person or persons involved
- Type of injury
- Other pertinent information

If poisoning is suspected, contact the Poison Control Center at 1-800-222-1222.

### **Automated External Defibrillators (AED)**

Automated External Defibrillators (AED) are located at the reception desks of the campus' OCOM Clinic (4th floor) and OCOM Hollywood Clinic. The devices provide simple verbal instructions for the untrained. However, if assistance is required, call Facilities or clinic staff before using an AED.

### **Steps for Managing a Seizure**

- A seizure cannot be stopped, so let it run its course. Ease the person to the floor and loosen restrictive clothing such as neckties.
- Remove any hard or sharp objects that may injure the person. Place something under the head for cushion.
- If possible, roll the victim to his or her left side. This way, sputum or vomit will drain out of the mouth away from the airway. **DO NOT PUT ANYTHING IN THE VICTIM'S MOUTH!** Seizure victims do not swallow their tongues.
- Contact 911 and the VP of Operations at 503-253-3443 x106 or Facilities at x160

### **Civil Disturbance or Demonstration**

In the event of a demonstration or a public disturbance:

- Avoid provoking or obstructing the demonstrators.
- Avoid the area of disturbance.
- Continue with your normal routine.
- Stay away from doors or windows if the disturbance is outside.
- If a class or lecture is disrupted, the offending person(s) should be requested to leave.

OCOM personnel will lock the main entrance if the situation appears to be a threat to the campus. Elevators and stairwells may also be locked down should the disturbance pose a threat to college personnel or property. If the threat appears to be actively trying to break into the building, all personnel on the first floor should make their way to the upper floors in preparation for a building lockdown.

### **Blood, Body Fluid or Infectious Agent Exposure**

A general rule for dealing with bloodborne pathogens is: "If it is wet, sticky, and not yours, don't touch." In the event you or another person is exposed, meaning bodily fluids have gotten in an eye, mouth, or other mucous membrane, or non-intact skin, follow the steps below to protect yourself:

- Immediately wash the area with soap and water or eyewash for 15 minutes as applicable. Two Eyewash stations are located in the campus building: one in the Group Treatment Room sink (4th Floor) and the other in the OCOM Herbal Medicinary sink (1st Floor).
- Contact OCOM Facilities at x160 for any assistance.
- Obtain medical help.
- Obtain an exposure report form from the clinic reception desk or from the Department of Facilities at x160.
- Notify your supervisor.
- Notify your personal doctor.
- It is required that you report any exposure to OCOM's environmental health and safety officer, Vice President of Operations and HR at x106.

## ***Threatening or Inappropriate Communication***

The objective of threat management is to determine the nature of a threatening situation. Determining intent, motive, and ability provides the essential ingredients for assessing the level of risk to a college employee or student. After determining the nature of a threat, a strategy is developed for defusing the potential risk.

**If there is a threat or inappropriate communication towards you or another individual, immediately contact 911.**

Communications containing any of the following should be immediately reported to a supervisor, who will report it to the appropriate dean, director, or officer.

### ***Threats***

All threats of harm to college employees and students received verbally, in writing, by telephone, email, text or fax, through an informant or in-person, should be reported. Any assault or attempted assault should be reported.

### ***Inappropriate Communications***

Many communications are not explicit threats, but are nonetheless cause for concern. Any communication that meets one or more of the following tests should be reported to the Vice President of Operations and HR at x106 followed by a report to the CARE Team using the CARE Team form, [available online](#) or from Elizabeth Miles:

- References to a special history or destiny shared with the employee or student.
- Evidence of suspicious behavior, stalking behavior, or research into personal affairs of the employee or student.
- Any form of "hate speech" focused on religious and historical themes involving the employee or student.
- References to death, suicide, weapons, violence, assassinations, acts of terrorism, or affection.
- Obsessive desire to contact the employee or student.
- Belief that the employee or student owes the person a debt.
- Perception of the employee or student as someone other than him or herself.
- References to public figures who have been attacked.
- References to individuals (or their acts) who have attacked public figures or committed notorious acts of violence or terrorism.
- References to bodyguards, security, safety, danger, etc.

### ***Violence or Crime in Progress***

#### **Do not take unnecessary chances**

- Remain where you are until the police or public safety officer arrives. Do not interfere with:
- Persons committing the crime/creating the disturbance.
- Law enforcement authorities who are on the scene.

If you are the victim of, are involved in, or witness any on-campus violation of the law such as assault, robbery, theft, overt sexual behavior, etc.,:

**1. Call the VP of Operations and HR immediately** (x106), or **911**, with the following information:

- Nature of incident
- Location of incident
- Description of person(s) involved
- Location of person(s) involved
- Your name, location, department, and extension number

**2. Get a good description of the assailant** if personal safety allows. Note their:

- Height
- Weight
- Sex

- Hair and skin color
- Approximate age
- Clothing
- Method and direction of travel
- Name, if known.
- Should an assailant attempt to or get away in a vehicle, note the make, model, license number (if possible), color, outstanding characteristics etc.

This provides vital information to investigating police officers.

## ***Utility Failure***

### **Major Utility Failure**

In the event of a major utility failure, contact OCOM's Facilities office at 503-253-3443 x160 or OCOM's Vice President of Operations and HR at x106.

- Give a brief, clear description of the problem.
- Remain calm.
- Follow directions of emergency personnel.
- If an evacuation is directed by emergency personnel, follow their direction and provide assistance to others in accordance with your training.

### **Utility Problems**

Call the Facilities Department at x160 or the Vice President of Operations and HR at x106.

General action guide:

- Gas leak – Vacate area if there is a smell of rotten eggs.
- Elevator failure – Push button on elevator intercom. Describe the problem to the dispatcher. Remain calm until help arrives. **Do not attempt to get out yourself.**
- Plumbing/ Flooding – If personal safety allows, evacuate the area.
- Electrical failure – Call the Facilities office at x160 or the Vice President of Operations and HR at x106. **Do not handle or touch the circuit breaker yourself.**

**If the building has been evacuated, do not re-enter the area/building unless you're told it is safe.**

## ***Suspicious Package Mail***

### **Suspicious Package/Letter/Object**

If you receive or discover a suspicious package, letter or object, do not touch it, tamper with it or move it. Report it immediately to the VP of Operations and HR at Ext 106.

#### **Characteristics of suspicious letters and packages:**

- Origin – postmark doesn't match the city of the return address, name of sender is unusual or unknown, or no return address is given.
- Postage – excessive or inadequate postage.
- Balance – the letter is lopsided or unusually thick weight — the letter or package seems heavy for its size.
- Contents – stiffness or springiness of contents; protruding wires or components; oily outer wrapping or envelope; feels like it contains powdery substance.
- Smell – particularly almond or other suspicious odors.
- Writing – handwriting of sender is not familiar or indicates a foreign style not normally received by recipient, or cut and paste or rub-on-block letters are used. Common words, names, titles, are misspelled, or special instructions like 'fragile,' 'confidential,' or 'do not delay' are present.

**If the letter or package is a mail bomb,** the letter or package may also have:

- Protruding wires, strange odors, or stains.

- An unusual amount of tape.
- Buzzing, ticking, or a sloshing sound.
- Irregular shape, spots or bulges.
- Excessive weight for its size.
- Letter bombs may feel rigid or appear uneven or lopsided.

## ***Hazardous Material Incidents***

### **Personnel Exposures/Contamination**

Remove exposed/ contaminated individual(s) from the area, unless it is unsafe to do so because of the medical condition of victim(s), or potential hazard to rescuer(s).

- Call 911 if immediate medical attention is required.
- If an incident occurs during normal working hours, notify Facilities at x160.
- Proceed to the nearest emergency eyewash / shower to flush contaminated eyes/skin for 15 minutes.
- Remove any contaminated clothing.
- Administer first aid as appropriate.
- Stand by to provide information or assistance including MSDS (Material Safety Data Sheets) to emergency response personnel (in cases where they are dispatched).

### **Contamination of Equipment/Facilities**

- Avoid spreading contamination by restricting access to the equipment/ area only to individuals who are properly protected and trained to work with the type of hazard (e.g., corrosive, flammable, biological, radioactive).
- Report details and/or request assistance from Facilities at x160 if the incident occurs during normal working hours. If the incident occurs after hours, contact the Vice President of Operations and HR at 503-253-3445 x106.
- Do not attempt any cleanup or decontamination procedures alone or without proper protective attire, including appropriate respiratory protection if airborne hazards exist. (Personnel must be trained and certified before using respiratory protection).
- Attempt spill clean-up if you feel it is safe to do so, you are familiar with the chemical properties of the spilled material, and are trained to handle spills.
- If there is a liquid spill, attempt to contain it by using appropriate absorbent material.
- Decontaminate the equipment/area using appropriate methods under environmental health and safety direction.
- Disposal of waste material according to campus biohazard disposal policies. Label the waste bag with a Hazardous Waste Label and dispose of the hazardous waste, or call Facilities at x160 for assistance with ensuring proper disposal.
- Stand by to provide information/assistance to emergency response personnel (in cases where they are dispatched).

### **Release to the Environment**

- Stop the release, if it is safe to do so.
- Follow procedures described above for contamination of equipment/facilities.

## ***Airborne Chemicals Release – Shelter-in-Place***

Shelter-in-place (SIP) simply means seeking immediate shelter inside a building. This action may be taken during a release of toxic chemical, biological or radioactive materials to the outside air or other emergency. If the outside air quality is threatened or compromised, shelter inside offers more protection. Although rarely called for, Shelter-in-place events usually last only a few hours. If you have earthquake kits of food, water, and other supplies, these can be used during Shelter-in-place events.

### **Immediate Shelter-in-Place:**

- When the release is nearby and the need to seek shelter is immediate.
- Stay inside a building.
- If outside, enter the nearest building.
- Remain in place until advised by emergency personnel that it is safe to leave.

### **Additional Procedures:**

- Move to floors above ground level. Shelter-in-place in an interior room without windows or with the least number of windows.
- Shut and lock all windows. Shut exterior and interior doors. Limit use of telephones to emergency calls only.
- If in a laboratory, reduce all operations to a safe condition as quickly as possible. Follow instructions from the professor in the lab or chemical hygiene officer.
- Do not use elevators. Movement of elevators pumps significant amounts of air in and out of the building.
- If you are in an office, close all windows and place clothing at the base of the door.
- Make yourself comfortable. Look after each other.

### **Delayed Shelter-in-Place:**

- When a release occurs off campus and there is time (30 minutes or more), move people to large enclosed areas.
- Follow directions of emergency personnel to move quickly to the Shelter-in-place location.
- Remain in place until advised by emergency personnel that it is safe to leave.
- Email or phone messages broadcast to the campus.

### **All Clear**

- The “all clear” will be given by public safety or the police.
- Open doors and windows.
- Return ventilation system to normal.
- Go outside until the building has been vented.

## ***Armed Intruder Scenario:***

**In the event of an active shooter on campus, OCOM follows the Run. Hide. Fight. protocol** as set forth by the Department of Homeland Security.

### **When an active shooter is in your vicinity:**

1. **RUN** – Have an escape route and plan in mind.  
Leave your belongings behind.  
Keep your hands visible.
2. **HIDE** – Hide in an area out of the shooter’s view.  
Block entry to your hiding place and lock the doors.  
Silence your cell phone and/or pager.
3. **FIGHT** – As a last resort and only when your life is in imminent danger.  
Attempt to incapacitate the shooter.  
Act with physical aggression and throw items at the active shooter.

## Emergency Campus Lockdown

Lockdown is used when an armed intruder enters campus. Lockdown is meant to keep persons in one safe location when there is an unknown threat outside of the classroom or building. If there is a threat to the campus from an armed intruder, **immediately contact the Vice President of Operations and HR at x106.**

### 1. When the threat is **outside** of the building:

- Secure all exterior doors.
- Close drapes/blinds (if safe to do so) then stay away from the windows.
- Classrooms and offices: lie face down, flat on the floor; cover head, get under tables/desks.
- Stay put! Move only if remaining where you are is more dangerous.
- In other areas (e.g. open spaces of campus.), “duck and cover.”
- In open areas, use objects immediately available (e.g., vehicles, trees, telephone poles, etc.).
- If in a completely open area, lay down and remain motionless.

### 2. When the threat is **inside** of the building:

- Secure all exterior doors.
- If in a locking office or classroom: Secure the room and move everyone along the wall closest to the hallway door.
- Shut off the lights to the classroom.
- Silence all cell phones.
- Open drapes and blinds (if safe to do so).
- Keep everyone as quiet as possible.

### 3. **Special Concerns for Students\*\***

#### (1.) Condition One:

- Get students inside the building and into classrooms as quickly as possible.
- Students who are locked-out of an office or room should seek shelter in the closest available room or evacuate the building immediately.
- Do not allow students back inside until the “all clear” is given by a college official or police.

#### (2.) Condition Two:

- Students and staff who are outside should proceed to OCOM’s Evacuation Assembly Area across Naito Parkway in Waterfront Park, at the Japanese American Historical Plaza.
- Remember to follow all instructions given by emergency response personnel, including orders to evacuate to another site away from the incident.

## Evacuation of Persons with Disabilities

- In most cases, evacuation will not be necessary or advisable. Do not evacuate unless instructed to do so by emergency personnel, a fire alarm has been activated, or danger is imminent.
- All persons should proceed toward the nearest safe exit as instructed by emergency personnel. When a person with a disability reaches an obstruction, such as a staircase, he/she should request assistance from others in the area.
- If assistance is not immediately available, stay in the exit corridor and call for help. If the exit corridor should appear dangerous (smoke, fire), proceed into the stairwell, if possible, and stay at the stairway landing. Close the door behind you to keep smoke out of the stairway. If the stairway should become unsafe, proceed to a safe area away from smoke and fire; closing doors behind you isolates the smoke. Call 911 and advise the dispatcher of your situation. If in a room with a window, signal rescuers by waving or placing a sign in the window.
- Do not open the window unless smoke is entering the room. If possible, place a wet cloth material around and under the door to prevent smoke from entering.
- Persons who cannot speak loudly should carry a whistle or other means of attracting attention and assistance.



**Note:** It is suggested that individuals with mobility, visual, or hearing disabilities prepare for an emergency ahead of time by informing their co-workers, faculty and administrators of the best methods of assisting during an emergency.

## ***Assisting Persons with Disabilities During Emergency***

**Persons who are Non-Ambulatory.** Always consult the person about the following:

- Preferred ways of being removed from wheelchair. Wheelchairs should not be used in stairways, if at all possible.
- Whether to extend or move extremities when lifting because of pain, catheter leg bags, braces, etc.
- Whether a seat cushion or pad should be brought along with the person if they are removed from the chair.
- Being carried forward or backward on a flight of stairs.
- After-care — if removed from the wheelchair (i.e. whether they prefer a stretcher, chair with pad or medical assistance).

### **Person with Visual Disabilities**

- Tell the person the nature of the emergency. Offer to guide him or her to safety.
- As you walk, say where you are and advise the individual of any obstacles.
- When safety is reached, help to orient the person and ask if additional assistance is needed. Do not leave them alone.

### **Persons with Hearing Disabilities**

(Persons who may not hear audible alarms and are in buildings that do not have visual alarm devices.)

Either:

- Write a note explaining the nature of the emergency. Include "Go to exit \_\_\_\_\_ now"
- Turn the light switch on and off to gain attention, then indicate through gestures or writing what is happening and what to do.

## ***Telephone Bomb Threat Checklist***

Bomb threats usually come on the telephone and generally are made by individuals who want to create an atmosphere of general anxiety or panic. All bomb threats should be assumed to pose a legitimate danger to the college campus population.

The [Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives](#) has published the following checklist to be completed any time a bomb threat is received by telephone. It is important to complete the checklist as soon as possible after a call is received so details are not forgotten. Give the completed form to a public safety officer.

### **Fire Response**

When Fire or Smoke is Discovered

Safely exit the building through the nearest clear exit. Do not use the elevator. In most instances, fire detectors will trigger the fire alarm. OCOM has **one** fire alarm pull station located in the Facilities office that will be activated by Facilities staff if detectors do not activate the alarm. Immediately exit the building and close any doors behind you. Do not re-enter the building until told to do so and given the "all clear" from public safety officials.

#### **If trapped in a room:**

- Place a cloth material around or under the door to prevent smoke from entering.
- Retreat and close as many doors as possible between you and the fire.
- Be prepared to signal from the window, but do not break glass unless absolutely necessary.

#### **If caught in smoke:**

- Drop to hands and knees and crawl to exit.
- Hold your breath as much as possible.
- Breathe shallowly through your nose, and use cloth (shirt or jacket, other) as a filter.

#### **If forced to advance through flames:**

- Hold your breath.
- Move quickly.
- Cover head and hair.
- Keep your head down and eyes closed, as much as possible.

#### **If clothing catches fire:**

- Stop, drop, and roll.

### **When a Fire Alarm is Activated**

Treat all alarms like a real emergency. **Do not assume it's a false alarm!**

- Follow emergency personnel directions.
- Walk — do not run — to the nearest exit. Alarm may not sound continuously. If the alarm stops, continue to evacuate.

- Use stairways for exit, do not use elevators. Do not push or crowd, use handrails in stairwells, and stay to the right.
- If willing and able, assist persons with disabilities. (“Evacuation of Persons with Disabilities,” page 12.)
- Feel doors top and bottom for heat using the back of your hand. If hot, do not open. If it is not hot, open the door slowly, while standing behind the door and to one side. Be prepared to close quickly if fire is present.
- Notify emergency personnel if you suspect someone may be trapped in the building.
- Proceed to the evacuation assembly area.

### **Fire Extinguisher**

- To receive training on proper use of fire extinguishers, contact the Vice President of Operations and HR: x106.
- Use the appropriate extinguisher for the type of fire.
- Use fire extinguishers on small fires only — trash cans or smaller.
- After extinguishing a fire, back away. Watch for re-ignition.

## ***Earthquake***

### **During an Earthquake**

- If inside — stay inside.
- Get under a desk or sturdy table or brace yourself within a narrow hallway or doorway and keep clear of windows or other items that can shatter.
- Duck, cover, hold.
- Do not run outside during an earthquake!
- Phone systems may be severely impacted. Limit phone usage to emergency calls only.
- Do not evacuate automatically. Outdoor hazards may be greater than indoor hazards.
- Many of the buildings in the Old Town Chinatown neighborhood are constructed of unreinforced brick which is particularly hazardous in the event of an earthquake. Evacuating our campus during or after an earthquake may prove more dangerous than remaining indoors.
- If asked to evacuate to assembly areas, move swiftly. Grab keys, personal items and emergency supplies only if convenient and safe to do so.
- Follow directions of emergency responders.

### **If in a crowded stadium, theater, or lecture hall:**

- Stay in your seat, protect your head and neck.
- Do not rush for the exits.
- Follow directions of emergency personnel.

### **If in an elevator:**

- If power fails, elevators will stop and lights will go off.
- Be patient. Emergency personnel will rescue you as soon as possible.

### **If outside:**

- Move to a clear area if safe to do so. Avoid falling hazards and stay away from buildings, trees, walls and utility wires.
- Duck, cover, and hold in an open area. Protect your head and neck. Stay in an open area until the shaking stops.

### **If in a vehicle:**

- Pull over and stop in a clear area. Avoid overpasses, power lines, and structural hazards.
- Stay with your vehicle.

### **After the shaking stops:**

- Expect aftershocks over the next hours and days.

- Check yourself and others for injuries. Report injuries to supervisor or emergency personnel.
- Use your training to provide first aid, use of fire extinguishers, clean-up spills, etc.
- Assess your surroundings, check for damage and hazardous conditions. Report them to supervisor or emergency personnel.

**If outdoors on campus:**

- Stay clear of buildings, trees or other falling hazard areas. Move to evacuation assembly areas.
- Follow directions of emergency personnel.

**When to go home:**

- In the event of a major earthquake, be prepared to stay on campus. You should not try to get home until emergency personnel say it is safe, the streets are cleared for travel, and most emergency conditions have been stabilized. The campus is prepared to provide emergency care and shelter in partnership with the American Red Cross.

***Airplane/Helicopter Crash/Explosion***

If an explosion of any type occurs, immediately call 911. Give all information to the dispatcher and stay on the line for emergency directions.

**If inside the building:**

- Seek cover under a desk, table, or other heavy furniture, which can provide protection from flying glass and debris.
- Remain inside the building until it is safe to exit,
- Follow directions of emergency response personnel.
